

FROM THE BOARD

What a year it has been for Tree House Books! We made huge strides this last year in a multitude of ways and, as always, we couldn't imagine doing this work without the support of you all. The title of this year's annual report really does say it all: "Growing Through and Going Through," and grow we did.

With your support, the support of our Tree House Books families, and the tireless work of our incredible staff, we were able to start 2021 with a bang despite the trials of the pandemic. This year alone, we gave away 80,000+books, developed critical new programs, launched the Traveling Tree House, and hosted our first in-person (COVID-19 safe) Philadelphia Literacy Day event in almost two years - and that's just some of the



highlights. As you'll see in this report, there were many more celebrations and mini-milestones.

Our new bookmobile, dubbed "The Traveling Tree House," had almost 250 stops and gave out over 12,000 books. We can't wait to see where it travels to in 2022. Hopefully you'll come along for the journey. We also launched our Black Girls Book Club for female-identifying teens and pre-teens to empower them to write themselves back into the world; a great step for expanding our programming to a broader age range and continuing to do the work of decolonizing literacy.

From a governing perspective, we've seen some exciting updates as well. From revitalizing our Advisory Board to gaining awesome new board members on our Governing Board, we are determined to continue to think strategically about how to grow and expand Tree House Books in the most equitable and community centered way possible - knowing that North Philadelphia will always be our roots.

This connection to the community is something I know was taken into close consideration as we hired two new full time staff members this year. As anyone who's been with us for a while knows, having five full time staff, all of whom now have full benefits, is a huge feat for a small organization like ours. I truly believe that our staff, both full time and part time, are unparalleled in their commitment to our mission and in their vision for our growth.

We're expecting another promising year of evolution and expansion in 2022 and in some ways we think this will be one of our most pivotal years yet. We so appreciate all of the support you have given us to get us to this point, and it's this continued support that will help us to scale our programming in a big way. One of our primary goals this year is to expand our physical footprint to be able to reach more young people - a goal that seemed like a pipe dream just a few years ago and now could be a reality sooner rather than later. We're proud of where we've been, but we know that there is so much more that we can do. We're looking forward to continuing to work with you to push the envelope and give as many kids as possible the opportunity to pursue their dreams.



FREE BOOKS



On March 27, 2021 we literally started "going" as we launched the Traveling Tree House with a large ceremony outside on Susquehanna Ave. Our Tree House kiddos were the first to jump on board and check it out before we went to Smith Playhouse for their season opening event. We gave away over 500 books in that one day alone!

The Traveling Tree House was our response to Covid-19 closings. If people could not come to us - we would go to them - block by block!

GOING THROUGH (PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS)

Words on Wheels

Words on Wheels was back at it again in summer 2021 - delivering a total of 2,715 books to 163 kids in 65 families. We even got the Traveling Tree House to deliver some books! Once again our grant partners at William Penn provided reading intervention services for 53 kids in K through 3rd grade. These families participated in one-on-one sessions and workshops like: "Having Fun with Sounds" and "Reading Comprehension Matters." We're so proud to say 46% of students showed reading growth and 54% of students remained the same. No students regressed - which is the whole point of Words on Wheels!

Traveling Tree House

When we launched the Traveling Tree House in March to great fanfare (check out the report on page 4) we knew we had something special on our hands! Since then, the Traveling Tree House gave away 12,204 books. We've been so thankful to have Kai, our Community Book Distributor, leading this program as it made 249 different stops this year - from our regular partners at Smith Playhouse and Urban Creator's Life Do Grow Farm - to all the schools, community groups, and festivals!

Giving Library

After closing for much of 2020, we were excited to reopen the Giving Library 2 days a week in May and 5 days a week by July. We implemented a strict cleaning regimen and made sure everyone was masked to enter. Even with this shortened season, we added 810 new members, bringing our grand total to 7,215 total members. We love that this resource was available to our community once again!

Branches and Partners

Our Tree house branches are a wonderful asset to local recreation centers and community spaces. Having small libraries in spaces like this promotes literacy during leisure time and through our partners. Currently we have 14 such branches around North Philadelphia, many of them in community partner sites. Our partners also support our neighborhood! Last summer, Urban Creators brought fresh produce and hot meals and set up once a week at Tree House Books.

Tree House Storytellers

This early literacy program not only helps prepare students for Kindergarten but also creates young readers that thoughtfully engage with books, writing, and storytelling that showcases Black and Brown characters that reflect themselves and those who they are in community with wherever they encounter it! This year we've worked with storytellers Sydney Pope and Thembi Palmer to bring this virtual program to more than 15 daycares and over 1,000 views on social media and YouTube.

Summer Literacy Studio

At the Summer Literacy Studio, we focus on language acquisition, recreational reading, critical thinking, and creative writing. This summer we went on 10 field trips. Some of our summer themes included: Harry Potter, the Olympics, water, and science. This year, we had 23 students a week for 6 weeks!

Equity Pod

In 2021 we continued our partnership with Black Education Matters for our Equity Pod. In the spring, we saw our numbers peak at 25 students. In the fall, as schools reopened, we continued to offer this safe, inclusive, and accessible learning space. Tree House Books educators support and advocate for our students facing adversity in their institutions.

After School Literacy Studio




Writing Ourselves Back into the World: A Black Girl's Book Club

In the last quarter of 2021, we were excited to launch The Writing Ourselves Back into the World Book Club! It's a weekly Black Girl (and female-identifying) book group exploring the idea, "Who are you?" We were compelled to start this club to serve our emerging teen and pre-teens participants. So far, 18 youth are participating in this new program!

Thanks to the amazing staff, authors and vendors, the community had everything they needed to enjoy the day.

















