

From the Board



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What an interesting and wild year 2020 was for Tree House Books! In this last year we celebrated our 15th anniversary, pivoted our programming due to the unexpected arrival of COVID-19, and created completely new initiatives to best serve our community during these ever-changing times. It was a whirlwind of a year for sure, and as difficult as it was at some points, we are so truly grateful for the immense support of our community members, Tree House Books families, funders and partners for helping us to make this a year full of



innovation, adaptation, and growth regardless of the circumstances thrown at us.

This past year we continued to give away books at a rapid pace, setting up a safe and socially distant outdoor library in front of Tree House Books when we had to temporarily shut down our typical Giving Library operations. In addition to getting books into the hands of readers in a variety of creative ways, we also saw the need to become an Emergency Food Distribution Center and began giving out meals three times a week alongside books and workbooks. As the year went on and our Tree House kids still couldn't return to school in person, another clear need arose and we quickly got our Equity Pods up and running. This program welcomes small groups of children into the Tree House so that they can have access to high speed internet and general help from our amazing staff while they complete virtual schooling.

As a board, we also had to make some adjustments, changing the way we interact with partners and funders and figuring out the ever elusive virtual event! In our 15th year of operations we worked hard to plan a celebration of how far we've come as an organization in our annual Champions of Literacy Event. Instead of the typical large, in person event we host yearly, we used that platform to host three virtual events: local authors reading to kids, interviews with authors who set their novels in Philadelphia, and hosting an important and thought provoking forum on the importance of Black representation in literature. Being able to celebrate and connect with our community through those events was truly a highlight of the year and something we plan on continuing in the future.

2021 will no doubt still hold some challenges as we continue to maneuver through COVID-19 safely, but we know now more than ever that Tree House Books is incredibly resilient and is always ready to adapt in order to best serve our community. We're already deep in the works of planning for some exciting growth and expansion for the coming year and beyond and none of these goals would be possible without you and your support. Below are just a few examples of what's to come:

- 1. Getting our Traveling Tree House bookmobile out into the community
- 2. Continuing to adapt Literacy Programs to meet kids in this unique time
- 3. Contributing to the strong fabric of this neighborhood

We're so thankful for everyone who contributed to the amazing progress and evolution we saw in 2020, detailed in this report. I'm positive that with your continued support and the support of others like you, Tree House Books will continue to grow and to do this important work in larger and more impactful ways.

Words On Wheels Book Deliveries and one-onone support with our Literacy Specialist Cheryl began


















Covid-19

Our immediate response

Mar 11 – THB Board meeting - Rumors of school shutting down for 2 weeks started.

Mar 12 – Learned that schools were shutting down. We contacted Archdiocese to inquire about requirements to become a food distribution center if needed.

Mar 13 – THB made decision to close programming for 2 weeks, along with the SDP closing. Staff quickly worked on a plan to engage with kids virtually. Staff planned to work offsite.

Mar 16 - Program staff started connecting online with kids - called "Program Kids Connect"

Mar 18 – We were approved as an Emergency Food Distribution center and made plans for 3 days a week distribution, prioritizing safety for staff and neighbors. We also set up a table for books and workbooks to be distributed.

Mar 23 – Food and book distribution took place for the 1st time.

Mar 24 – THB Executive Committee met online to make contingency plans for all programming and events.

Our Year Continued

In August, we held 3 Fireside Chats online to connect with our community of Alumni, Supporters, and Families.

Words on Wheels hosted an online reading training for parents.

In September, we halted the meal distribution due to declining demand.

Our Equity Pods started in partnership with Black Education Matters— a safe place for distance learning for school district kids

Held a 2020 Reading promise festival with Read by 4th included virtual poetry night, story-time with Cousin John, and the opening of our Little Tree House (Little Free Library)

Champions of Literacy was a 3 day event with virtual experiences for everyone!

Started a partnership with Barbershop Books to get books to our neighborhood barbers


Began working on a Bookmobile idea to bring books to the neighborhood

Tree House Kids created a Virtual Kwanzaa video and story – check our YouTube!


